**AMENDMENT TO ELECTRONIC FILING AND SERVICE
CASE MANAGEMENT ORDER**

15. *Pro Hac Vice* Motions.

A motion for admission to practice *pro hac vice* shall not be filed in the Master Case. See Rule 8.0 (c) of the Rules for Admission to the Practice of Law, effective January 1, 2015. “Separate *pro hac vice* admission shall be required in every case in which the applicant seeks to act as counsel.” If a motion for admission to practice *pro hac vice* is filed in the Master Case, the Clerk’s Office shall reject the filing.

A motion for admission to practice *pro hac vice* in multiple cases shall be filed as one transaction using the multi-case filing feature. However, the movant must comply with all of the requirements of Rule 8.0 of the Rules for Admission to the Practice of Law, including but not limited to payment of the required fee to the West Virginia State Bar for each individual applicant in each individual *pro hac vice* admission.

All other requirements of the *Electronic Filing and Service Case Management Order* entered on December 17, 2014 (Transaction ID 56485649) remain in full force and effect.
