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EXPLANATION OF LEVELS OF TREATMENT

Level – Group Residential Level 1

- A structured 24 hour group care setting
- Moderate to severe adjustment difficulties in school, home, and/or community
- Youth whose needs can best be met in a community-based setting
- Can function in public school and in a group residential setting

Level – Group Residential Level 2

- A structured 24 hour group care setting
- Moderate to severe adjustment difficulties in school, home, and/or community
- Persistent patterns of disruptive behavior
- Youth exhibits disturbances in age-appropriate functioning and social problem solving
- Youth cannot function in public setting without significant psycho-social and psycho-educational support.

Level – Group Residential Level 3

- A highly structured 24 hour group care setting
- Severe disturbances in conduct and emotions
- Youth unable to function in multiple areas of their lives
- Goal of stabilizing the child's serious mental condition

Level – Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility

- Long Term Facility
- Severe and Complex Symptoms
- Not responded to other levels of treatment
- Possible danger to self or others
- Severe dysfunction in several major life areas (home, school, community, etc.) due to a mental health condition
- Staff must be licensed psychiatrist, Master's Level fully licensed Therapists, Bachelor's Level staff, registered nurses and high school graduate or GED



Students participate in athletic programming that exceeds the expectations of simple recreation and addresses the knowledge, skills, self-discipline, and abilities similar to those exhibited by athletes participating on a typical high school sport team. Each treatment group comprises a team and daily attends to "practice" which includes skill drills, agility drills, and

conditioning. Teams face off in regulation games where competition is minimized and replaced with an emphasis of overcoming challenges and self-achievement.

When not participating in athletic programming, students participate in experimental/outdoor programming where they complete pioneering projects utilizing wilderness education techniques and participate in experimental education activities that challenge their ability to problem solve, work together as a team, and overcome personal challenges to complete the activity.

A wide range of activities are facilitated on-site via the availability of a full-court gymnasium and over 30 acres of wooded area that include trails, campfire rings, hiking trails and low element challenge obstacles.

It teaches the communication skills needed to intervene in the crisis in a therapeutic manner and to minimize aggressive behaviors from the young person when attempting to drain off dangerous emotions. In the event aggressive behavior is unavoidable and imminent, CPI techniques help protect staff members from injury and teach the physical techniques needed to safely control aggressive and acute behavior.

Additionally, appropriate staff to student ratios are strictly maintained 24 hours a day. Supervisory staff are on site 24 hours each day to provide support, training, crisis response, and clinical response to staff and students as needed. Administrative and medical personnel are on-call 24 hours a day and seven days per week to provide crisis support as needed.
