Three regional truancy meetings next week

CHARLESTON, W.Va. – Supreme Court Justice Robin Jean Davis and Nineteenth Circuit Judge Alan Moats are scheduled to hold the first of fourteen regional meetings on truancy next week.

The public is invited to all the meetings and no registration is needed.

Although anyone is welcome to attend any meeting, the locations were chosen because they are the geographic centers of certain regions. Therefore, the meeting at 10 a.m. Tuesday, Sept. 13, in Courtroom No. 4 in the old Kanawha County Courthouse in Charleston is specifically for people in Kanawha County.

The meeting at 10 a.m. Thursday, Sept. 15, in Circuit Judge Thomas A. Bedell's Courtroom in the Harrison County Courthouse in Clarksburg is specifically for people in Barbour, Doddridge, Gilmer, Harrison, Lewis and Upshur counties.

The meeting at 10 a.m. Friday, Sept. 16, in Courtroom No. 1 in the Monongalia County Courthouse in Morgantown is specifically for people in Marion, Monongalia, Preston, Taylor and Wetzel counties.

Justice Davis and Judge Moats, whose circuit encompasses Barbour and Taylor counties, encourage parents, educators, social service workers, court officials, and anyone who works with children on a daily basis to attend. Justice Davis has been appointed by the Supreme Court to coordinate and expand judicial truancy programs in West Virginia.
