Justice Davis to visit children whose truancy project won prize

PRINCETON, W.Va. – Supreme Court Justice Robin Jean Davis will make a surprise visit to four Mercer Elementary School children because their project on truancy won third place in the West Virginia State Social Studies Fair last week.

The project entitled “So what if I miss school?” focused on anti-truancy programs in Mercer County and in West Virginia.

Justice Davis will visit the school at 12:30 p.m. on Thursday, April 26. Their parents and teachers know she is coming to present certificates, but the students do not.
